Section 1: Review

I started Foundations with the idea that somebody will recognize my strengths, and basically place me in whatever course that is "best" for me. I drifted along the course until I realised I needed to define my path myself, and that came when I struggled with working within the briefs set in Graphic Communication Design. After fumbling and struggling, I finally saw the requirements of a brief as a guide, something like a wall that give shape to my ideas. I learnt to ask for opinions and advice rather than answers, then realised what is important is how I feel about my works, rather than solely relying on others to categorise me.

For this unit I want to focus on interactions between the participants and I, because in a conversation between two people, both parties exchange ideas and as a result learn more about each other. My outcomes would mostly be performances, but I am more interested in turning my interaction into something visual, and that could be photographs or photographs arranged in a publication.
